

Annual Meeting – Tuesday, April 19, 2017 – 7:00 pm – Linn Town Hall

Present were Chairman Weiss, Supervisors Jones, Rasch, White, Palmer, Clerk/Treasurer Sue Polyock, Atty. Brian Schuk and twenty (20) residents.

Chairman Weiss called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The Chairman read the order of business noting that there would not be a sanitary district report as Ted Peters will not be present.

The clerk read the minutes of the last annual meeting. **Kathy Leith/Doris Roan motion to approve the minutes of the April 19, 2016 annual meeting. Carried by voice vote.**

The clerk gave an overview of the financial report distributed. **Christine Jones/Roy White motion to approve the financial statement as presented. Carried by voice vote.**

Old Business: none

New Business: Allan Polyock, N146 Bissell Rd, in discussing the Linn/Hebron cemetery, would like the Town Board to keep pursuing the ability to help out Hebron Township with their request for upkeep of the cemetery.

Kathy Leith, W4161 Linton Rd, does not want to continue looking into helping with Linn/Hebron cemetery. They had a cemetery board fund and the Town should not own property over the state line.

Becky Merwin, W4322 Linton Rd, states it makes no sense to support Linn/Hebron cemetery. It will open up for other cemetery boards to come to the Town of Linn for help.

Dick Malmin, W1991 S. Lakeshore Dr, agrees with Polyock. They are our neighbors, it is called the Linn/Hebron cemetery and was a shared cemetery. A lot of Linn people are in that cemetery.

Chris Jones, W3746 Linton Rd, under state statute 60.10 (2)(e) purchase of land, would ask to prohibit purchasing of land. Atty. Schuk said the statute more appropriate would be 60.10 (1)(e) – Cemeteries: authorize the acquisition and conveyance of cemeteries under s. 157.50(1) and (3). The statute is to authorize, not prohibit.

Doris Roan, N1744 E. Valley Park Rd, asks what the Town is going to purchase.

Alex Palmer, N599 Mill Rd, said no action has been taken. Board is not at the point to purchase part of the cemetery.

Chris Jones stated Hebron Township supervisors came to us and they should have gone to the families of people who are buried there.

Roy White. N1978 Birches Dr, said the Board needs to wait for more information.

Tim Rasch, N1549 Bluebird Dr and James Weiss, W4656 Tory's Trail, said it is premature to do anything at this time.

Tom Leith, W4161 Linton Rd, likes Malmin's idea of having private donations.

Atty. Schuk stated before anything is done, it would have to come back to a Town Meeting for approval.

Larry Rademaker, W4390 N. Lakeshore Dr, asks who is "them"? It is the Hebron Township Supervisor and the cemetery board. He stated that Delavan Township has donated to the Delavan Cemetery.

Two items were brought up that are not powers of the Town meeting and were told they could be brought up at a Town Board meeting

- Short term rentals
- Neighbor problem with dead trees and thistles

Tim Rasch gave the date of the next annual meeting be held on Tuesday, April 17, 2018 at 7:00 pm in the Linn Town Hall.
